The trip was a complete success and for some of our young people it marked their first-time leaving Doncaster and their families. The residential allowed the students to gain practical life experiences, helping them to improve their independence, learn new skills, increase their confidence by travelling to an unknown place and meeting new people and engaging in new activities outside of their routine and comfort zone. This enhances the practical and hands-on experiences which already form an important part of the post-16 curriculum at Coppice School.

Everyone had such an amazing experience, we have already started planning next years.
